

[RAIFORD, FL] Ministry continues at Union Correctional Institution (UCI) at Raiford, FL. Randy Brown, Dwight Preheim, Tony Cozier, Sam Harman, Jerod Powers, and Len Showalter travel weekly to UCI on Thursdays and work with Chaplain Barry Hedrick.

Randy and Sam are teaching Celebrate Recovery (CR) for the second year. Working in a dorm facility has required that the format be changed to a large group to accommodate almost 100 inmates at one time. The lecture and open discussion time is about two hours each Thursday morning. Other courses have been taught, but CR seems to be in high demand by the prisoners.

The rest of the team is in UCI on Thursday afternoon. Typically only two leaders are needed to teach Evangelism Explosion (EE) to the twelve inmates, so

This semester the EE class has taken a new approach - it is led by inmates! The outside team only has to observe and assist as needed. The goal is to raise up leaders and therefore multiply the evangelism effort inside the fence. Also, Sam has begun teaching EE on Tuesday evenings at Marion Correctional Institution in Ocala with Chaplain Larry Durham to a class of thirteen inmates. Please pray for this work as many lives are being changed each week. LMI

Terry Casey, "Mr. Voice," was the master of ceremony. Rev. Jerry Scheck opened the night with prayer. Ministry pictures from the various national and international LMI trips from 2011 were displayed during dinner. At the conclusion of the delicious buffet meal several door

prizes were awarded with Jerry Scheck winning the grand prize of a carry-on suitcase and a \$500 certificate towards a 2012 international trip.

After the introduction of the LMI board members and Cathy Russi's special music presentation, a captivating video "Lost at Sea" by Reinhard Bonnke was shown. Mike Bondanza handled all the audio-visual needs. Rev. Len Showalter addressed the 120

attendees and encouraged everyone to participate in evangelism. He focused on several trips planned for next year, but especially one to Ouagadougou, Burkina Faso, in January.

Rev. Guy Landry (pictured with wife, Galina) brought the keynote address assisted with interpretation by Paul Muzichuk. He detailed LMI's effectiveness acrosss Russia and Siberia. As a result his church has planted

4 churches and equipped a church in Krasnokomensk which has subse-

quently planted 17 churches. That church has equipped a church in Chita which has in turn planted 10 churches. Many people have been reached for the Lord and another trip is planned in 2012 to take the Gospel even farther.

Following Guy an opportunity was given by Bill Cook for all to participate in the continued financial support of Len Ministries in 2012 to take the Gospel to more people around the world. Pastor Michael Nelson closed the evening in prayer for Guy and Galina Landry and for Len and Marcia Showalter.

Guayaquil, Ecuador Len Ministries takes the Gospel to South America

[GUAYAQUIL, ECUADOR] Randy Brown and Len Showalter left Jacksonville, FL, on October 20. They connected with Dennis Dixon in Miami who was coming from Atlanta, GA. The three then boarded a flight to Quayaquil, Ecuador.

The team was met at the airport by interpreter Tito Campos and his fiancee, Gypseia (pictured). Tito is also an associate pastor under Pastor Nelson of the Samborondon Alliance Church. Len Ministries has worked with Tito previously in Portoviejo, Ecuador, and in

Santa Cruz, Bolivia. The men were divided up and taken to two different homes to stay. After a bit of touring of the downtown and riverfront area

on Friday, Len began the evangelism teaching sessions that night at the offices of the church. An overflowing crowd necessitated that they move to a larger room to accommodate the 35+ students. Genesis (pictured below) and several other students admitted that they received an assurance of their faith that night. On Saturday the class had dwindled down to 23 to partake in the four hour session.

Following the classroom lecture Randy, Dennis, Tito, and Len took teams to a shopping mall that was close to the church offices. Due to the apprehension of the students only 11 desired to have the witnessing experience, but after two hours the students' attitudes had changed. They were so excited and returned with many wonderful stories surrounding the 18 professions and assurances in Christ.

Sunday morning Len preached in the Christian Missionary Alliance Church. He shared a message around Matthew 7:21 - 23



and detailed how a person can know for certain that they will be in Heaven with God. Pastor Nelson closed in prayer for many that wanted to have assurance of their salvation.

Afterwards the entire congregation relocated from the restaurant where Sunday services are held to a newly acquired building just outside the city of Samborondon. There the new grounds and unfinished build-

ing was prayed over and dedicated to the Lord Jesus.


A final evangelism teaching session was held Sunday evening at the church offices. Attendance was up to 17 and many came with more successful testimonies of their sharing the Gospel with others including family members. At the

conclusion the teaching Pastor Nelson addressed the group and admitted that he was entirely taken by surprise that people in the mall would listen to a presentation and would make a profession. He said that this was not his prior experience.

The team left Guayaquil on Monday satisfied that much passion for doing evangelism had been planted in the church. All were hopeful that they would be invited back to fully train the congregation in 2012.

On the flight back to Miami and then to the respective final destinations there were more opportunities to share the Gospel with fellow travelers. The total for the trip was 30 professions and assurances of faith in Jesus Christ.
