Plans & Prayer

**The preparations of the heart in man, and the answer of the tongue, is from the LORD.

[JACKSONVILLE, FLORIDA] Welcome 2011! Len Ministries is expecting great things this year. Plans are being set and much prayer is given over each event.

Working with churches in the Jacksonville, FL, area remains the key building effort of the ministry. Currently we are teaching evangelism and training in the harvest field with Pastor Rick Crook of Arlington Assembly of God located at 88 Arlington Road. Efforts continue to locate additional churches to reach into more of the community.

The Len Ministries team of Randy Brown, Dwight Preheim, Tony Cozier, Sam Harman, Jerod Powers, and Len Showalter travel weekly to Union Correction Institution (UCI) and work with Chaplain Berry Hedrick. Lifestyle classes are held on Thursday morning. Approximately 96 inmates are currently being taught Celebrate Recovery. On Thursday afternoons more than 30 are being trained in evangelism. See their 2010 results on page 4. The prison is being changed from the inside!

In addition to the current trip to Guatemala (see page 3), more trips are planned for 2011. In June Len Ministries will be celebrating 20 years of ministry in Russia. It started in 1991 with a trip to Nizhny Novgorod where a church was planted. This summer we will return to Pastor Semikov's Light of Christ Church in Nizhny. Plans may include a boat trip down the Volga River. Equipping of pastors and lay leaders in evangelism in Yaroslavl and preaching in Pastor Guy's church in Ivanovo is in the works.

The trip to Russia will extend out to Siberia. A team will go to Chita to the

Salvation in Jesus Church where they will equip leaders to win their city for Christ. Additional international travel in 2011 may include Ecuador, Kenya, Burkina Faso, and Bangladesh.

Prayer continues to be needed for each of these projects. Our prayer ministry was revitalized at our Annual Banquet held in November. If you desire to participate in any trip with prayer (or financially) visit our web site and let us know. And don't forget our golf tournament April 8. Come and have some fun!

After a short video entitled "The Fisherman," Pastor Len Showalter addressed the attendees and focused in on the banquet's theme - "It's Time for Fishin'!" He then gave an opportunity to participate financially with the ministry.

After a closing song by Cathy, a prayer by Rev. Jerry Scheck, Terry dismissed everyone.

Flores, Guatemala

Len Ministries trains churches to equip missionaries

[FLORES, GUATEMALA] On Saturday, February 8, Beth Whisenant, Cathy Russi, Helen Adamec, Mike Bondanza, Randy Brown, and Len Showalter boarded a plane in Jacksonville, FL, headed for Miami, Guatemala City, and then Flores. The team was joined in Miami by Sveta Yarygina who was coming from Kirov, Russia, to assist with the teaching of Guatemalan pastors and leaders in evangelism.

The team stayed at the Calvary International (Go to Nations) campus in San Benito which is just outside Flores. Base directors Jim and Bonnie DeHart welcomed the group. The goal of the trip was to equip local churches with evangelism and then have them train their congregations as well as the missionary interns that would be processing through Calvary twice a year.

On Sunday morning Len spoke at "The Calvary" church with a sermon topic of "Scriptures I Do Not Like." Prayer for the people followed the sermon. Afterward the team went to the pastor's home to pray for his wife who has been recovering from surgery. That evening Randy spoke in one church and Mike in another. The women assisted with prayer at the conclusion of each service.

Training started on Tuesday, so that opened up one free day. Emilio Arana, director for Evangelism Explosion in Guatemala, arrived Monday morning and the team chose to visit Tikal, the largest Mayan ruins located about an hour away. The weather cooperated as it was the end of the rainy season. The team explored the grounds and pyramids. There was much to see including the wildlife.

The students arrived Tuesday morning. They were a pastor, two leaders and one interpreter from Mount Zion Church, a leader and an interpreter from the Church of the Nazarene, and three interpreters that were from various Catholic churches. During the teaching the team went to a retirement/nursing home and shared the Gospel with the aid of interpreters. 40 residents heard the message and 17 responded to receive Jesus as their Lord. That afternoon the team took the evangelism students to the streets around the base camp and talked to 14 people and 8 professed Christ.

Wednesday morning the team went to a small shopping mall. With the aid from two interpreters they shared the Gospel with 11 persons and had 5 professions. Upon their return to the campus the team took the students to the streets and talked to 28 people in various homes and had 21 professions.

As the teaching continued on Thursday the team returned to the mall with one major difference - no interpreters. They had to rely on their "Spanish" skills and they had their best results with 7 contacts and 7 professions. That afternoon all went to the streets and shared the Good News to 23 people with 12 professing Christ.

Friday was an extra teaching day with

another opportunity to go to the streets. The entire group went to the area of Mount Zion Church and visited with 56 people and had 41 make decisions for Jesus! At the end of the day 10 students (9 local and 1 American - Mike) received their certificates.

Saturday morning the team packed in preparation for their return trip. Once that was completed they headed to Flores for a little shopping, some relaxed witnessing, and dinner overlooking the lake. On Sunday morning after the necessary goodbyes the team headed for Jacksonville and Sveta returned to Kirov, Russia.
