Len Showalter and 34 outside members lead by John Bryant met with the 38 inside prisoners on Thursday afternoon, April 23. They stayed together (except for nights) through Sunday afternoon, April 26.

The schedule permits 3 1/2 days on location with the prisoners. Daily lessons were taught from the Word of God by several pastors and lay leaders and then reinforced with "hands-on" activities that all participated in. Wonderful praise and worship was led by Bob Wilmot. By Sunday all felt as one family and at least 22 of the prisoners had professed Christ as Savior.

The prison leadership graciously supports the Kairos ministry. There

is ongoing discipleship as the outside team typically returns the next weekend for "grouping" training, and then one weekend each month for regular support and follow-up. Additionally, there is ministry offered to the family members of each prisoner.

The classroom instructions were from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m. with in-the-field (OJT) training from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. held around the Tutu Mall. Following the OJT

was an hour set aside for reporting the results. Additionally, Pastor George Phillips of



the St. Thomas AG church was hosting an evening tent revival in the area.

Some of the clinic attendees assisted with witnessing and with the alter call response at the tent revival meeting. And they also worked the area outside the tent at a nearby basketball court while the service was ongoing and had 16 professions of faith. There was much Harvest to be had.


