Retirees Hear the Gospel



Making Soup for Retirees

n Saturday, January 31, Randy Brown, Dwight Preheim, and Len Showalter left the Jacksonville, FL, airport and headed for Guatemala City, Guatemala. After a brief change of planes in Atlanta, GA, and a 3 1/2 hour flight they arrived at the new international airport.

The weather was in the 40's at night and 50's in the day due to a very cold front which caught everyone unprepared. But that did not stop the ministry effort. The traveling team was met by Woody LaJara, VP of Central and South America for Evangelism Explosion (EE), Carmen, his wife, David Gomez. Emilio and Tania Arana, local EE coordinators.

After experiencing the local traffic the team safely arrived at their hotel in downtown Guatemala City. "At least everyone is driving on the right side of the road," was stated several times by the travelers. After a dinner overlooking the city, the team rested and adjusted from the flight and the 1 hour time difference.

Woody preached Sunday morning on Acts 2 at Emilio's church, La Biblia Abierta, part of the Iglesia Evangelica Centro Americana (IECA) denomination. Afterward the team traveled to the city of Amatitlan. It is located on a pretty lake where many people stroll its boardwalk on the weekend. Len spoke on Acts 3 at a IECA church that evening.

On Monday the team headed to a private retirement home where about 35 people lived. Some of the residents suffer from early stages of Alzheimer's. All were well taken care of despite the lack of government financial assistance. As they gathered about lunch time, Len shared the Good News of Jesus Christ, and the team prayed for personal needs including salvation for one Jehovah Witness that worked at the home. The team's prayers and food staples that had been purchased were well received.

Plans for Tuesday included the touring of Antigua. It is an old capital city of Guatemala that was threatened by the Agua volcano and several major earth-

quakes in the 1700's. The town is now a tourist area with the huge, 12, 500 foot volcano in the background. Shopping and witnessing were the highlights of the day. At the Central Park 3 Gypsy girls and a young couple received Jesus as their personal Savior. Many tracts were handed out.

Wednesday was the start of the EE clinic at another IECA church located in a residential area of Guatemala City. There were 17 pastors and leaders in attendance and it was cold. This was made worse due to the fact that the block construction of the church had no west wall and therefore no heat! During the day our team could be found witnessing at a tortilla shop with its open fire oven because there they would be warm and there was always a constant flow of patrons.

On Thursday the teaching continued and it was the first taste of some local cuisine: lima bean coffee and hot plantain juice. At least it was hot! This was also the first evening of on-the-job-training (OJT). 24 people were approached by 8 teams, 22 heard the Gospel and 19 people professed Christ or received assurance of their salvation.

Tortillas became very popular and the team got acquainted with one family-owned business that was run out of their home down the street from the church. The mother trained the 7 children in making tortillas and all helped with the preparation and packaging. The mother and the older girls received Christ on repeated visits. The younger children enjoyed being held by Randy and climbed all over him. Len assisted several girls with their English lessons.

On Friday those being trained in the clinic shared their testimonies and the Gospel part of the teaching when witnessing with their trainer. The results were that 20 persons were approached with 14 hearing the Gospel and 9 made a profession to accept Christ as their Savior.

OJT was first on the agenda for Saturday with the trainees doing the entire presentation. Although concerned with their own abilities, the results were wonderful. 42 people were approached with 30 hearing a presentation of the Gospel and 22 people made a profession of faith.


Upon returning to the church there was much celebration over the results of more than 100 lives eternally changed during the week. The students then refocused and were able to take their exams. All of them passed!

After a brief stop to say goodbye to the tortilla mom and children, the team headed to the hotel to pack and then they were off for a 12-hour ride in a rented van to Honduras on Sunday. LMI

volcanos, Honduras is known for its hills. Randy Brown, Dwight Preheim, and Len Showalter found this fact out as they went from Guatemala City, Guatemala, through El Salvador, to Tegucigalpa, Honduras.

The 12- hour trip was accomplished in a 14 passenger rental van with the back seat loaded with luggage. The volcanoes around Guatemala City were amazing. but the ones in El Salvador were unbelievable. One volcano in particular could be seen for 60 miles in either direction! Rivers marked each border and the southern part of El Salvador brought to mind the American mid-west and Mexico. Honduras was mountainous and hilly like Colorado.

Accompanying the team on the road trip on Sunday, February 8, was Woody and Carmen LaJara, David Gomez, Emilio and Tania Arana, and Nadia Gonzales. The Americans were so thankful for Tania and her 23 year old niece, Nadia, as they were

the EE clinic administrator.

Monday was a day of rest and meetings to plan for the upcoming EE clinic. Len met Pastor Julio from Iglesia Bautista Loarque who was hosting the effort. All were thankful that the weather there was much warmer than in Guatemala.

On Tuesday the clinic started with 15 pastors and leaders in attendance. Randy and Dwight with the assistance of Pastor Julio's bi-lingual adult children, Julio, Jr., Nancy, and David, went to the streets as Len and Woody taught the lectures to the trainees. Randy and Dwight came back with a report of 11 professions/assurances of faith including two teenage Mormon girls who gave their hearts to Christ!

Wednesday was the first night of OJT for the clinic. The church had scheduled visits with many of the surrounding Catholic families. The trainees shared their testimonies and the trainers shared the Gospel with wonderful reception. Of the 18 March 2009 Len Ministries Newsletter Pg. 5

people visited by 8 teams, 17 made a profession or received assurance of their faith in Jesus Christ alone!

Randy and Dwight with the aid of Julio, Jr., and Nancy went to the campus of the University of Honduras (100,000 students) on Thursday during the lecture time. They reported another 5 professions during class breaks even though many of the students were busy with their own schedules.

Additionally on the second night of OJT there were 23 people visited and 21 made professions of faith in Christ. Len reported sharing with a Catholic grandmother who had recently visited the Holy Land with her church. The grandmother, her daughter, her granddaughter, and a grand-niece all prayed the sinner's prayer.

Friday was the last day of the clinic and much had to be accomplished. First on the agenda was the final OJT where the trainees do the entire presentation. To best use their two hours they went to the streets and the Lord was with them. They returned after talking to 38 people and there were

29 professions/assurances of faith! The attendees then had to refocus and take their final exams.

In a little over an hour there was reason for great celebration. All 3 pastors and 12 leaders in the clinic passed their exams and found out that more than 110 people had made a profession of faith during the week!

During dinner at the hotel Friday night the team spent time reflecting on all the new relationships in Honduras and on all the lives touched. Soon the reality set back in and the team got busy packing again.

Saturday found the team back in the 14 passenger rental van. The 12 hour return trip leaving Tegucigalpa, Honduras, through El Salvador, to Guatemala City, Guatemala seemed a little longer than the coming trip there. During one rest stop, Randy successfully shared the Gospel with a girl selling hammocks.

The Sunday flight to Atlanta and then to Jacksonville, FL, seemed a little longer, too. But it was wonderful to see loved ones waiting at the airport and to arrive safely back home. **LMI**






